El Puente de Encuentros is a certified nonprofit organization whose mission is to bring cultural awareness to New Mexico's behavioral health needs and to take action to meet those needs. This fall our annual fellowship program will continue to focus on mentoring future behavioral/mental health professionals.

Our program will define for participating students what qualities are required for a profession in the field of Behavioral/Mental Health. Analytical tools will be provided to guide students in their academic experience, and/or their professional aspirations. Our program will also motivate students to pursue and understand how the field intersects with the social, cultural, economic and political forces that affect and/or facilitate a profession in Behavioral/Mental Health. To accomplish these goals, El Puente de Encuentros fellows will work on expanding their understanding of either an area of academic and professional interest or of a particular clinical direction they wish to explore. As part of the program, El Puente de Encuentros fellows will participate in mandatory group sessions in which assigned readings will be discussed, and ideas explored. When appropriate, fellows will engage with community organizations and businesses that will provide direct professional mentorship.

Our fellowship will consist of two semesters of instruction, including two monthly meetings with fellow students and professionals. In addition, fellows will research work/professional opportunities within the state of New Mexico.

- Have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better*
- Able to attend 2 hour Monthly meetings*
- Be enrolled as a degree seeking junior, senior or graduate student*
